

Part 3: Bus Services

- Provision of services by local transport authorities

Legislation in force from 24 June 2022.

The Act repealed sections of the Transport Act 1985, fundamentally Section 66:

"... in Scotland, a council (other than the council for Orkney Islands, Shetland Islands or Western Isles) shall not have power to provide a service for the carriage of passengers by road which requires a PSV operator's licence."

The Act amended the Transport (Scotland) Act 2001 by inserting:

- 2A Provision of bus services etc. by local transport authorities
- (1) A local transport authority may provide a service for the carriage of passengers by road using vehicles that require a PSV operator's licence to do so.
- (2) The local transport authority must be satisfied that the provision of such a service will contribute to the implementation of their relevant general policies.

Contract price increases

Impact of covid-19

Contract prices renegotiated - ~35% increase Several would otherwise have been terminated Overhead costs no longer shared with private hire work

A few routes retendered

Contract extensions and retenders

- Contracts were due to expire December 2021
- Most extended until December 2022

 But only able to extend Skye and Lochaber until March 2022

Licence or Permit?

According to guidance the same legal entity cannot hold both a PSV O-licence and a Section 19 Permit.

Many of our schools have minibuses on S19 Permits.

So we decided to use S22 Large Bus Permits which the Traffic Commissioner issued.

- Three Project Officers appointed (2 from my team, 1 external)
- New buses leased
- Secondhand buses bought
